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		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Frequent cleaning of work areas and equipment between use ● Provide extra waste facilities ● Follow Public Health England guidance if a Covid-19 case is reported at the facility. <p>Maintaining social distancing and avoiding congestion:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Provide signage so people can find their destination quickly ● Review how people walk through the facilities and adjust this to reduce congestion and contact between users ● Regulate the entry to facilities to avoid overcrowding ● Single use doorways to avoid congestion, ie one way entrances & exits ● Single / limited use of toilet facilities to avoid congestion in confined spaces 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Monitor effectiveness, particularly at times of peak usage ● Train staff and volunteers to promote compliance to facility users ● Train staff and volunteers to report / deal with issues of non-compliance ● Regular checks of signage and guidance; make sure it's still in place and current.
